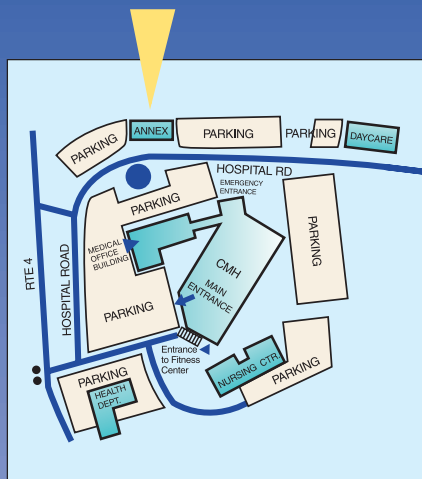

Special Occupational Therapists are available with training in sensory integration theory and treatment techniques. Our therapists are qualified to administer the Sensory Integration and Praxis Test (SIPT) as well as a variety of other pediatric developmental and language assessments.

Children with:

- Developmental Delays
